The couple and their children moved back to Toledo, Ohio in 1965. After 10 years of marriage the couple divorced. Bobbie remained in Toledo and took a job at HUD, after leaving HUD she returned back to her field and worked at Toledo Hospital as an X-ray technician. A newspaper ad caught Bobbie's eye for an X-ray instructor at Owens Community College. working with her students. During her illness, she came across many of them during doctor visits and hospital stays. She would light up when they would recognize her and share with her stories about the days when she was their teacher.

Burks Jr., who resides in Maryland and her brother Ronald Burks preceded her in death, sister in law Pearl Burks, and several close cousins. Bobbie has three nephews and one niece. Her daughter Valerie and son in law Michael Greer have three children, Adam, Alexis and Aaron. Bobbie was a proud grandmother.

In 1980 Bobbie joined Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. She began attending meetings and there she met some great/fabulous friends and sisters. She enjoyed gardening, sewing, decorating and listening to music. Bobbie was determined, loyal, andShe will be missed.
