Dorotha Stubblefield, 79, was born on July 3, 1934 in Murray, Kentucky. She was the youngest of 3 children born to the late Noxie and Adelle (Cowan) Johnson. Dorotha was an active, devoted and much beloved member of her church, her community organizations and Sorority, Delta Sigma Theta, Inc. Dorotha was a graduate of Tennessee State University (Nashville) where she was a distinguished graduate in Biology in 1956. Later that year, she married Rob Mason Stubblefield, and they made their home in Toledo, where Rob spent his career with Toledo Public Schools as an educator and administrator, and Dorotha began her 30-year career as a bacteriologist and microbiologist with the Toledo Public Health Department Laboratory. She ultimately became the Laboratory Director, and retired from the City in 1987 after a long and distinguished career.

A devoted Christian, Dorotha was a former member of the Mount Zion Baptist Church and a Founding Member of United Missionary Baptist Church, where she was a Deaconess and a member of the Board of Christian Education, and worked with the ministerial staff of the Youth Church.

Dorotha dedicated her life in service to others. She was a proud and dedicated Golden Life Member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and over the decades tirelessly served her Sorority in numerous Chapter Board positions and committees. She is a past member of the Board of Trustees of the Toledo YWCA, a Charter Member of Charms, Inc. and a devoted volunteer with the Christ Child Society.

Dorotha was an avid reader, enthusiastic traveler and a day could not be considered over until she completed her daily crossword puzzle. She spent many hours with her close circle of friends and her greatest joy was in being known as “Nana” and spending time at the home of her daughter, son-in-law and grandchildren.

Dorotha is survived by her daughter Cheryl and son-in-law, Troy, grandchildren Annabel and Gabriel, and Rachel Hodges; brother Perry (Frances) Johnson, of Murray, Kentucky; sister Marjorie (Joseph) Anthony of Yellow Springs, Ohio and a host of loving nieces, nephews and cousins.

Visitation services will be held from 4 until 8:00p on Friday, April 18th at the Dale-Riggs Funeral Home. Wake services will be held at 11:00am with funeral services to follow at 12 noon, Saturday, April 19th at the United Missionary Baptist Church. followed by Burial 9:00 am Monday April 21, at the Historic Woodlawn Cemetery.
