George Frank Kendrick, 102, passed away December 27, 2014, at Hospice of Northwest Ohio in Toledo. Born in Clarksville, TN during the Presidency of Ohioan William Howard Taft, George lived through 18 presidents, the Great Depression and two World Wars. George moved to Muncie, Indiana where he worked and lived for ten years. Later he joined his brother in Toledo and immediately signed up with Laborers' Local 500, where he worked as a brick layer laborer for over 30 years. At the age of 64 (after 50 years of working), George retired. Retirement lasted three months. He went back to work for 19 more years.
