Izzetta Dotson, age 93, of Toledo, Ohio passed away Monday, December 5, 2011. She was born to the union of Louie Lathan and Rosa (Wilson) Lathan in Cairo, Illinois. Izzetta moved to Toledo and graduated in 1936 from Libbey High School. She married Alvin Dotson and together raised 5 children while attending Calvary Baptist Church. In her earlier years, Izzetta worked for Erie Ordnance Depot and was one of our first Black insurance agents in Toledo, with the Mammoth Life Insurance Co. Later in life, she worked as a foster grandparent at St. Anthony Villa. Because of her successful work with the program, she was asked to represent them and be recognized at the White House. She served on the nurse's board at Galilee Baptist church for many years. She later joined Grace Temple Church Of God In Christ where she faithfully came every Sunday until she became ill. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Alvin Dotson; son, Alvin Leonard Dotson; great - granddaughter, Dreamer Chatman; son-in-law Ethaniel Chatman Sr. and daughter-in-law Ida B. Dotson. Izzetta leaves her legacy with her children, Melvin (Marilyn) Dotson, Brenda Chatman, Craig Dotson, and Terry (Carolyn) Dotson; nine grandchildren; 15 great- grandchildren; one great great-grandchild and a host of other relatives and dear friends.
