“ We at the Vet Center knew Michael as Jose. We could usually depend on Jose coming in late, fashionably with a bluetooth in his ear and sit down for one of our sessions. All of us at the Vet Center are able to talk Veteran to Veteran and are able to understand each others feelings, nightmares, triggers, guilt, depression, etc. While each of us had different experiences our commonality was from a war zone, most Vietnam. A good night we would share events in our life and how we dealt with them....good and not so good. It is unfortunate we who served 45 to 50 years ago are still plagued by "scars that do not show".

As I became more familiar with Jose it seemed as if he was not getting adequate help and response from his claim. We planned a trip to Wauseon where I had filed my claim and felt confident if they would help him he would be in good hands. Eventually he did receive more VA disability as a result. Jose thanked me many times for the trip and introduction to the Fulton County VA rep.

When Jose did stroll into Group it was tough to keep him away from a box of doughnuts, cookies or whatever had been donated that day. Usually we could go toe to toe on scarfing down the treats, but in the end he could always out distance me with his consumption. Sometimes we would try to keep the box just our of reach, but eventually Jose would get up and take the box with a smile as he knew we were messing with him.

When Jose had the floor he would talk slowly with his low rumbling bass voice. One of the guys in the group "Dan" would usually be lulled to a brief nap when Jose was talking. Conversely Jose would usually fall asleep when "Dan" talked. He would always wake up smiling when he knew he had taken a nap and those of us still awake were snickering like a bunch of school kids as he awakened.

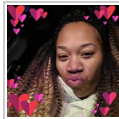
