Leonia Lyle was the fourth child born to the late Howard and Catherine Snorton on May 9, 1928 in Needmore, Tennessee. She graduated from Burt High School in 1947.

On Monday, September 7, 2020 at 11:43 p.m., Leonia journeyed to her heavenly home as she was comforted by family and friends at Hospice of Northwest Ohio in Toledo, Ohio. Truly blessed, God welcomed Leonia to her eternal home at ninety-two years of age.

As a young child, Leonia joined Williams Chapel Church and was baptized by Reverend A. Long. Later, she joined Mount Pisgah under the leadership of Reverend L.D. Fort.
