October 24, 1925 - January 18, 2024

Lydia Jean Ellis-Archie (affectionately known as “Bird”) was born October 24, 1925 in Vaiden, MS to Sim and Adeline Johnson-Ellis. Of their eleven children, Lydia is the “baby girl”. Carroll County, MS is where she received formal education and during her fellowship with Jeff Chapel C.M.E. Church, Lydia made her early confession of faith in Jesus Christ. Following her migration to Toledo, OH in 1946, Lydia lived with her cousin, Mary V. Boles and her family. While residing there, Lydia was employed by a private hospital where she worked in tray service. Subsequently, Lydia became a nurse’s aide and she dearly enjoyed working with the newborn babies. She was employed at Toledo Hospital and St. Vincent.

Lydia joined Phillips Temple C.M.E. Church in Toledo. On September 1, 1962 Lydia married Booker T. Archie. To their union two children were born: Alice Lavonne (who was stillborn) and Dwayne Todd. Lydia joyfully taught children in Sunday School, sang in the Senior Choir, and most recently served the Lord’s table as a stewardess.

Lydia’s housekeeping was immaculate. She shared the maintenance of an annual vegetable garden with Booker and occasional help from Todd. She was proficient in canning and was an excellent cook who enjoyed sharing what she prepared with others. Also, she provided daycare service in her

home for

several years because she loved the children who were entrusted to her. Lydia used every opportunity she had to learn as she would attend community classes and later in life she brought her husband, Booker along with her.

Lydia Jean Archie passed away in her son's arms on January 18, 2024, at The Toledo Hospital.

Lydia was preceded in death by her husband Booker T. Archie and daughter Alice Lavonne Archie.
