Margie Dawn Scotland was born on October 2, 1952, along with her twin brother Larry Corbitt, in Calhoun City, Mississippi to the union of her parents Woodrow and Maggie Corbitt. She passed away on June 24, 2024 at the University of Toledo Medical Center.

The youngest daughter of 10 siblings, Margie relocated to Toledo, Ohio at the age of five after the passing of her mother to live with her cousin, Dora Garner (nee Russell). She was later adopted by Harold and Dora Garner and remained in Toledo, OH. The Garner family lived on Prospect Ave., moved to Marthal Rd. in the late 60s and were lifetime members of St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church.

Margie was educated in the Toledo Public School System where she met many lifelong friends including Valerie (Parr) McCain whom she met in Junior High School. Margie started working at The Toledo Blade in 1974, where she worked in various capacities including Personnel, Human Resources, Pay Roll, and Circulation and met many friends. She retired after 41 years in 2015.

Margie was the backbone of her family, the Sleepy Hollow Athletic League, Scotland State Farm Insurance and, when her health allowed, her husband's political campaigns and activities.

Margie enjoyed television shows, music, cooking and sports games and always lent her helping hand to assist in any project or activity for her family, friends or church. She was a beloved mother, sister, aunt, friend, coworker and church member and will always be remembered for her warm heart, kind and thoughtful spirit, fashionable dressing and delicious cooking. She loved sending cards to loved ones showing just how much she cared.

Margie Scotland was an active member of St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church for over 65 years. She was a member of Job Circle and served in various roles and committees at the church including serving as the Secretary of Job Circle until her passing.
